## Grades will consist of:

3 Lecture Exams; 100 points each = 300 pts. Final Exam; 100 points each = 100 pts. Research Paper = 100 pts. Total Points 500 pts.

There will be three lecture exams and one final exam in this course, each one covering a section of the outline. Each exam will be worth 100 points and <u>not</u> comprehensive. If you cannot make it to an exam, then you must notify me **24 hours before**, or up to **48 hours after**, the test date. There are no make up exams for unexcused misses. A form of makeup for the missed exam may be available if you missed an exam under extenuating circumstances. All exams are 50 multiple-choice/true and false questions, 2 points each. Grades will be based on total point accumulation.

<u>Tentative Exam Dates:</u> The exam schedule is tentative; it may fluctuate due to changing circumstances and how the class fairs overall. Exam dates will be announced.

During the semester you will turn in a 4½-5 page paper on any biology topic dealing with zoology that I approve. This is a research paper so it should have a list of references. If you cannot find a topic, I will choose one for you. More will be discussed about this paper later when you receive a handout on it. Make note of minimum dates to have a topic, March 7<sup>th</sup>, and turn in the paper, May 9<sup>th</sup>. Labs will include microscopy of selected organisms and dissection of selected representative organisms for each major group of animals. Lab participation is required and mandatory. There will be a series of laboratory quizzes in class, announced, for an unspecific amount of points. Quizzes and points will depend on material covered.

## Attendance

All students are expected to attend class. A daily attendance is taken. Any work done in class such, as labs, quizzes, etc. cannot be made up. If you miss class regularly, I will have you withdrawn from the class. All work must be handed in on time or 10% will be deducted for each calendar day the item is late.
